
Occasionally, I find myself completely stumped on what to write as part of the Pastor Perspective. There are many thoughts and ideas swirling around in my noggin, but none that come to the forefront. There is a lot that is happening in our church, community and nation. Sunday, June 24th we heard about the mission trips to Guatemala and Georgia. Next week we have the joint Vacation Bible School sponsored by area churches. In July we have the Feed the Flock Day camp. (See more information in this newsletter.) I have shared with you news about Hope House of Pickaway County, the new homeless shelter for men and families, due to open on July 15th. On Saturday June 23rd we held a "Fill the Bucket" fund raiser. A group of volunteers stood on major intersections in the city sharing information about Hope House and asking for donations. National news has been dominated by the controversial issue of separating and detaining children from their parents who have attempted to enter the country illegally. As of yesterday, there will be a change in that policy and children will no longer be separated and children who have been separated will be reunited with their parents. We will have to keep an eye on what will happen in the future.

There is a lot going on. Summer has never been a time to slow down and relax. Our routines – what we do on any given day – may change but, we are still as busy as ever. With so much going on around us we long for a time apart; a time of relaxation; a time for vacations. Sometimes we get to do that; at other times we are simply too busy.

Yet, the Lord our God calls us to commit to times to put all else aside to rest and reconnect with our Lord. You know it has always amazed me how often Jesus went away for a time of prayer and rest. He didn't always get to do that. However, I think that if Jesus needed time apart, how much more do you and I need to rest and reconnect with the Lord. 

Ryan Trapp called the meeting to order at 6:33 pm

Pastor Kraus led the council in prayer

Shelli Speakman led devotions for the council

Secretary's Report: Dennis Bothel provided the minutes for April 11 meeting. Jim Ewing motioned to accept the minutes. Gary Montgomery second. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Marisha provided the Treasurer's report. Giving was up in the month of April due to the fact that a member provided an annual contribution instead of a monthly contribution. So the year to date giving is \$4,233 over the year to date expenditures,

Pastor's Report: Pastor Kraus provided the summary of his work which included office hours, hospital visits, meetings he attended and messages to members of the congregation. He talked about men's homeless shelter and how the group is trying to get the shelter off the ground is going to meet again on Thursday May 17. He also talked about the new sermon series which is going to begin on Sunday June 17. He also talked about the seven young people who are going to be confirmed at the blended service on Sunday, May 20. Kim Manson motioned to accept the confirmation of the seven young people on Sunday, May 20. Tony Crist seconded the motion and the motion passed. Jim Ewing motioned to accept the report and Gwen Minor seconded. Motion passed.

Team Reports

Education: Vacation Bible School will be held June 25-28 at Community Methodist Church. Trinity will be doing Imagination Station again this year. In addition, Trinity will be in charge of the pre-school area. Confirmation boxes will be available before the service. Last Sunday school for the year was May 13. There will be one Sunday school in June, July, and August. Rally day will be in September.

Congregation Life: 100 flowers were passed out on Mothers Day Sunday. Church picnic will be the last Sunday in July.

Stewardship: Sally talked to Billie and Pastor about raising the usage of online giving. On June 10, stewardship team members will be available to answer questions about online giving as well as to help people sign up.

Outreach: Team has decided to send the Angel fund monies to the Children Charitable Foundation of Pickaway County Inc. Fathers Day Bake Sale will be on Sunday June 17. A new team leader is needed.

Worship: Summer reading will start on June 3. Donations for new hymnals and Bibles will be publicized at the different services.

Property: Windows for the basement have been ordered. Tree in the playground will be coming down after preschool ends. Roof on the property at 134 Union Street needs to be replaced. Leaks are also occurring around the chimney. Team wants to tear down the chimney. However, this will cause another problem because the water heater is gas and is vented through the chimney. If the chimney comes down then the water heater would be needed to be replaced. Team has a quote that it would take around \$11,000 to replace the roof, repair the leaks, remove the chimney and replace the water heater. Shelli Speakman motioned to use up to \$12,500 from the Undesignated Memorials. Kim Manson seconded. Motion passed.

Preschool: Cost of tuition for Preschool is going to increase \$5 per month next year.

Old Business

A member of the Circleville Police Department provided a walk through dealing with possible security issues. Can return and provide a written report at no cost. Council supported the idea.

Doris Young motioned that the old church van be gifted to the 1st Church of God at 25822 State Route 159. Gary Montgomery seconded. Motion passed.

New Business

The Updyke distribution was allotted as follows: \$1,000.00 to Nate and Katie Dresbach and \$2,679.14 to Guatemala (Emma & Renzo Lopez).

The idea of reducing the number of newsletters from 2 to 1 per month was discussed. Ways to reduce the number of newsletters will be looked into.

Sunday May 27 new members to council as well as members going off council will be recognized.

Larry Jeffers motioned to go into executive session and Tony Crist seconded.

Tony Crist motioned to adjourn and whole Council seconded. Motion passed.

Meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Meeting adjourned at 9: 25 pm

COUNCIL MINUTES

JUNE 12, 2018

Members Present: Keith Connell, Tony Crist, Evan Debo, Jim Ewing, Kim Fausnaugh, Sally Hafey, Tammy Hughes, Larry Jeffers, Kim Manson, Beth Miller, Gary Montgomery, Ryan Trapp, Rojanne Woodward, Liz Young. **Members Excused:** Shelli Speakman

Others Present: Pastor Kraus, Mike Williams – Property, Marisha Eveland – Treasurer.

Call to Order: Kim Manson called the meeting to order at 6:30pm. Pastor Kraus opened the meeting with a prayer. All members introduced themselves.

Devotions: Devotions were given by Ryan Trapp.

Officer Selection: Tammy Hughes motioned for Rojanne Woodward to serve as Secretary and Evan Debo to serve as Member at-Large on Administration Team. Larry Jeffers seconded and the motion passed.

Secretary's Report: Ryan Trapp motioned to accept the May minutes with two corrections to be made. The motion on how to use Updyke money needs to be included. Also, need to clarify that pre-school tuition increase is \$5 monthly. Tony Crist seconded and the motion passed. Correspondence from Doris Young was read to council.

Treasurer's Report: Marisha Eveland provided the Treasurer's report. May giving was down \$4,816 with annual giving down \$3,159. YTD expenses are over budget by \$1,448. Net YTD shortfall is \$7,750. Ryan Trapp motioned to accept the report. Tony Crist seconded and the motion passed.

Pastor's Report: Pastor distributed and reviewed a summary handbook for council members. Pastor provided a written report to council. Summer sermon series will be based on the qualities of justice, simplicity, generosity, inclusivity, and love. A new members' class will be on June 17th and 24th with a reception for new members on July 1st. Pastor has been working with other churches in the county and PICCA to provide emergency shelter for homeless men and families through Hope House of Pickaway County. A community picnic including Trinity, Presbyterian church, and Community United Methodist church will be on August 18th from noon to 4pm. Tony Crist motioned to accept the report. Evan Debo seconded and the motion passed.

Synod Assembly: Sally Hafey reported on the Synod Assembly held June 1st and 2nd. She attended workshops on Congregational Hospitality and the SOAP (Save Our Adolescents from Prostitution) project. She encouraged all to attend next year's Friday night worship which is open to everyone.

TEAM REPORTS

Education: Marisha reported that Bible School will be the last week of June from Monday to Thursday. A team chair is still needed for this team.

Congregational Life: A team chair is needed. The team includes Beth, Autumn Miller and Sara Ruff. Keith Connell said that he would like to be added to the team. They are currently working on gifts for dads for Father's Day. Also, they are planning a cookout to follow the combined service on July 29th.

Stewardship: Sally Hafey reported about new app we can get on our phones called Give Plus to make giving easier.

Outreach: A chair is needed for this team. Tony reported they are working on the bake sale for Father's Day. Funds raised will go to Hands for Disabled.

Worship: Worship team did not meet in June.

Property: Mike Williams reported that the windows have been completed in the pre-school. The tree on the playground is still not down due to the rainy weather. The alarm for the security system is now working. Kim is waiting on a written report of suggestions from the police department. Council will further discuss to see if additional security procedures need to be implemented. Mike said that a new water softener is needed for the kitchen for the dishwasher and icemaker. Gary Montgomery motioned to spend up to \$1200 out of Maintain Trinity money to purchase a softener. Sally Hafey seconded and the motion passed.

The Sandy's have been working with PICCA to replace the refrigerator in the 156 Union Street house. PICCA has a program which will remove and replace the refrigerator at no cost. The refrigerator will remain the property of Trinity if the Sandy's were to move. Evan Debo motioned to accept this offer from PICCA to remove and replace the refrigerator. Larry Jeffers seconded the motion and the motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS

New Van: Jim Ewing has an estimate from Red Barn for church Logo and Name to be on new van. Letters will be 4 ½ inches tall and name will be displayed on both sides of van. Logo, church address and email will be on back of van. Ryan Trapp motioned to use up to \$250 from undesignated memorials to cover the cost. Evan Debo seconded and the motion passed.

Facility Use Policy: This is still pending.

Security System Update: 12 to 15 keys are being given to police department to carry in cruisers.

NEW BUSINESS

Update of Council & Team Information: Council members were asked to review and correct contact information.

Mission House: Marisha reported that we have not received any contribution toward Trinity's portion of the rent for the mission house. The rent pay by the tenant is \$520, Trinity pays \$350 for a total of \$870. \$87 is kept by 4J for their management fee. Trinity's annual obligation of \$4200 was expected to be met by donations but no donations have been received this year. Council needs to decide how this will be covered and may need to make it part of the annual budget next year. Keith Connell will be discussing this need with the Scharenburg committee to see if it may be able to help with this year's obligation.

Devotions: Sally Hafey will do devotions for July and members volunteered for the rest of the council term.

Council Retreat: A council and team retreat will be on July 13th from 6 to 9pm.

Audit: Audit for 2017 financial reports is needed.

Credit Card Policy: We are in need of a policy on use of credit cards for the church, so we are better able to identify details of all charges on our credit cards. Rojanne volunteered to check on policies used by other organizations.

Family Mission Week: Marisha said that instead of Family Mission Week we will be participating locally in the ELCA's "God's Work, Our Hands" event on September 9th.

Adjournment: Tony Crist motioned to adjourn. Tammy Hughes seconded and the motion passed. Meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

STRONGER AND BETTER TOGETHER -- JOINING JESUS IN THE RESTORATION OF THE WORLD

Business matters consisted of voting on members for the synod council and church wide assembly; and an introduction of launching a major capital campaign. If I heard correctly, it is going to a 2-million-dollar goal. More details will be coming soon.

Friday evening the fellowship dinner was held at All Saints Lutheran in Worthington followed by the Synod Wide Worship Service. It was by far the highlight of the conference. The worship service is open to everyone.

On Saturday our own **Pastor Merlyn Seitz** was among several pastors who were honored. Since no conference was held last year, 2 years of honorees were mentioned. Did you know Pastor Seitz has served 51 years in the ministry?

Also, on Saturday, **Gary Pecuch**, Youth and Family Ministry Congregational Coach for the Synod gave a talk on how important youth ministry is. His position was created out of response to the great need that we all share to pass on the faith to our young people. The overall objective of the position is to provide assistance to congregations in the area of youth and family ministry focusing on developing healthy long-term sustainable ministries.

There were several workshops to choose from. I attended two.

First workshop was **Congregational Hospitality**

Reverend Katie Kerrigan, Director for Evangelical Mission led the session. We were given a paper with a bull's eye on it. There were 5 circles making up the bull's eye. They were from the center going out labeled: Closed; Friendly; Welcoming; Inviting; and Missional. Like most churches, we fall somewhere in the welcoming circle. We provide greeters, all inclusive bulletins, screens, nursery, coffee between services. This does nothing to get them inside the door. We discussed how to transform from welcoming to inviting by taking small steps at a time.

Second workshop was S.O.A.P. **Project -- Save Our Adolescents from Prostitution**

Sister Sally Burk led the session. We labeled small bars of soap with the national human trafficking hotline number. They will be placed in motels. 12 to 14 is the average age of entry into child "prostitution" in the U.S. 77% of all child trafficking victims will go on to participate in adult prostitution. If the church would like to participate the cost is \$135.00 for 1000 bars and labels. We will attach labels on the bars, then distribute.

I find attending these conferences very interesting and informative. Each church is allowed two voting delegates. I was the only one from Trinity. I hope next year someone can join me. More can attend, but only two have voting rights. If you don't want to come for two days, just make the effort to attend the worship service. You will be amazed.

A Note from Bishop Dillahunt

Grace and peace be with you in the name of the Risen Jesus Christ.

My dear family of faith in Southern Ohio,

Over this weekend the words to a hymn kept coming to mind, "God of Grace and God of Glory" (ELW 705) specifically, verses 2 and 3 and the pointed words of the refrain: "Grant us wisdom, grant us courage for the living of these days, lest we miss your kingdom's goal."

Just over two weeks ago we gathered in assembly under the theme, 'Being Church Together...Building up the Body of Christ: What does the Lord Require of You?' We did the business of the Synod and Church, we were in worship together, we heard a powerful keynote from Pastor Jerome Taylor that moved some to action, we heard about the mission and vision of this territory and we passed a resolution speaking against the separation of children from their families. It is increasingly important that the Church's voice be heard.

Earlier this month, I shared with you that I joined Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton and ecumenical and inter-religious partners in a [statement addressing concerns over immigration policies](#) and the separation of children from their families. At the assembly, over 200 people voted for and passed a resolution calling the Synod to action... "Therefore be it resolved that this Assembly urge the congregations of the Southern Ohio Synod to appeal to their congressional representatives expressing concern regarding the injustice of separating children from their families seeking refugee status in the United States of America."

There are many who are hurting in the world from, hunger, abuse, invisibility, racial injustices, poverty, killings, mental health issues, anxiety, and the pain and suffering goes on. As Church, we are Jesus' presence now. We share and invite others into God's love and grace. We trust that God is in the middle of the messes and we believe, as the Gospel for this Sunday assures us, even in the storms of life Jesus is there, calming the storms that rage.

Please continue to pray. Please continue to be the voice of the Church. Please continue to be part of sharing, inviting and claiming Jesus' love.


